Lead-Safe Certification for Family Child Day Care Facilities - https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/codes/philadelphia/latest/philadelphia/pa/0-0-0-191361#foot-15-1) that has been made effective after January 1,2020. This law applies to all properties built before March 1978. If the property was built after February 1978, the owner is exempt from lead-based testing however must submit documentation of proof that the property was built after February 1978.
